## It's Harvest Time

### It's Harvest Time!

Don't you just love the season of autumn? The air becomes cool; the leaves on the trees start to turn glorious shades of yellow, red and orange. We live in Wisconsin and autumn is gorgeous here. (All seasons are beautiful in Wisconsin!) Wildlife is busy gathering food for the winter and crops of all kinds are being harvested. It is harvest time for all those who sowed into the ground seeds of beans, corn, squash, pumpkins, etc.

If you didn't sow any seed, you can't get a harvest. The Webster's dictionary defines harvest as: 'The season of reaping and gathering in corn or other crops. It especially refers to the time of collecting corn or grain, which is the

chief food of men, as wheat and rye.' 'The product of labor; fruit or fruits.' This is the season to gather in what has been sown. The Bible says in Genesis 8:22, "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease." This is a promise of God given to Noah after the flood. Throughout God's Word there is a seedtime and harvest principle. In the beginning, Adam and Eve sowed rebellion toward God and reaped a curse. But, praise the Lord, God sowed His only Son into the earth to take the curse upon Himself by suffering, dying and rising again. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not

perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved."

God sowed His best seed for us. When a farmer sows seed, he knows that to produce the best crop, the most abundant crop, he must sow good seed. Jesus was the best seed! "I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just one grain; it never becomes more but lives by itself alone. But if it dies, it produces many others and yields a rich harvest." John 12:24 AMP This principle works in our lives also. Did you know that our words and deeds can be seeds? Are we sowing words of blessing

to others or words of anger and complaining? Are we sowing good deeds into other's lives or keeping the seed we do have all for ourselves? "Be not deceived; God is not mocked, for whatsoever a man sows that shall he also reap." Galatians 6:7

Harvest is a wonderful time. If we continually sow seed, we will reap a continuous harvest - you have God's Word on it!
